The festival will provide performance opportunities for students playing piano solos. The festival is an incentive program designed to nurture the students' love of music. Each student entering will have the opportunity to have his or her best performances of two selections (one chosen from the syllabus and one contrasting piece) evaluated by

one of the finest artists/teachers in the area. We hope that this opportunity will encourage them to share their love of music through performance. Each student will receive a gift, adjudication and a certificate of participation with ribbons for Outstanding, Excellent, Good, and for Fine Effort.

Our theme this year is **"All That Jazz".** If a student receives an Outstanding ranking, he or she will be eligible to participate in the Honors Recital, which will take place on Saturday, March 22, 2025 and Sunday March 23, 2025 at The Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Princeton, 50 Cherry Hill Road, Princeton, NJ 08540.

The entry fee is \$45.00 per student. In addition, each participating teacher must work at the Festival. Therefore, to enter your students, please fill in the Registration form, as well as the Job Sign-up Form. The student and teacher registration forms must be completed by **January 31, 2025 for in-person audition registration. No incomplete or late entries will be accepted; NO CHANGES will be made to either selection once the application is received. NO SCHEDULING CHANGES PERMITTED.**

PIANO TEACHERS FORUM FESTIVAL Summary of Job Descriptions

Advance Preparations

Judges Coordinator - Recruit judges, handle papers, briefing, lunch orders, payment, gifts for judges *Paperwork* - Photocopy & assemble packets of evaluation sheets and certificates. *Recitals* – Schedule students for Honors Recitals, print programs, manage procedures. *Scheduling* - Process money and forms. Schedule playing slots. Related mailings, lists, etc.

Festival Day

Set up - Arrange furniture, rooms, label doors, rooms, etc. Place signs indoors & outdoors.
Registration – Greet and check off arriving students' names on the Master Schedule.
Waiting Room Monitor - "Host" students before they go to Alcove; maintain student roster.
Runner - Call students from the Holding Area to your alcove; monitor schedule. Alcove
Monitor - "Host" 2 judges and 6 students, keep track of schedule & papers. Gifts
Distribution - Distribute gifts; clean up at the end of day.
Tallying – Process evaluation sheets, record ratings, assemble teachers'
envelopes. Clean Up - Rearrange furniture, straighten. Remove all signs & paperwork.

Piano Teachers Forum of Central New Jersey Festival

Rules and Information

The Piano Teachers Forum Festival is designed to be a motivational performance opportunity for musicians of all ages and skill levels. Entrants perform prepared selections in a non-competitive environment for widely-respected adjudicators. Each performer receives written comments on his/her performance, a Certificate of Participation, and a gift as a remembrance of the occasion.

Performance Expectations

1. All pieces must be performed from memory.

2. Students must provide music with measure numbers at the beginning of each line for the judges. Only authorized photocopies will be accepted. If music is being downloaded, there must be a legitimate website printed on the bottom; if printed from CD-ROM, the CD must be brought to the Festival with a printed copy. Students with unauthorized photocopied music will play for comments only and will be denied a ribbon. Playing from an Ipad or tablet is not allowed. These students will play for comments only and will be denied only and will be denied a ribbon.

3. The student will perform for the judge without other observers. Teachers and parents may not confer with adjudicators about students during the Festival or the student will be disqualified.

4. Each student will:

a. Bow before they audition and bow after their audition is complete. This is to ensure students eligible for the Honors Recitals know proper performance practice.

b. play a specific memorized warm-up exercise assigned by his/her teacher. The purpose of this exercise is to allow time for the student to adjust to the piano (all pianos on site will be tested and assessed by the judge prior to the festival).

c. perform one piece selected from the syllabus.

d. perform one piece contrasting in style and/or period (Baroque, Classical, Romantic or Contemporary). No arrangements or excerpts are permitted. All pieces must be original piano literature. Both selections must be of a comparable level.

Performance times are as follows: Levels 1 & 2......8 minutes Levels 3 & 4.....10 minutes Levels 5 & 6.....11 minutes Levels 7 & 8.....14 minutes

<u>Awards</u>

All entrants will receive written comments on their performance to use with their teacher for further study.

All participants will also receive a Certificate of Participation. Ribbons will be attached for *Outstanding*, *Excellent*, *Good* and *Fine Effort* Performances.

Each entrant will receive a Festival gift.

If a student receives an *Outstanding* ranking, he or she will be eligible to participate in the Honors Recital.

Registration and Scheduling

1. Active PTF members may submit an unlimited number of performances.

Since our Festival is cooperative and attracts a large number of students, it is imperative that each participating PTF teacher complete an appropriate job related to the Festival. Jobs will be assigned by the Festival Committee. We reserve the right to accept only students entered by PTF teachers who meet their job requirements.

2. Festival participants must be in at least the First Grade and no younger than 6 years old as of January 1st the year of the Festival (no 4 or 5 year olds).

3. No applications will be processed after the given deadline.

4. Due to the number of students and the complications involved, we cannot accommodate specific scheduling requests. However, to the best of our ability, we will honor your broad preferences as indicated on the application.

5. Students may participate on any level represented on the syllabus, regardless of age.

6. No fees will be refunded.

7. No student substitutions will be accepted.

Do not have the student register before they have the video performance completed. All teacher registrations are still due by January 31st. No applications will be processed after the given deadline. No fees will be refunded.

Virtual Audition- Festival Rules and Information

The Piano Teachers Forum Festival is designed to be a motivational performance opportunity for musicians of all ages and skill levels. Entrants perform prepared selections in a non-competitive environment for widely-respected adjudicators. Each performer receives written comments on his/her performance, a Certificate of Participation, and a gift as a remembrance of the occasion.

Performance Expectations

- 1. All pieces must be performed from memory.
- 2. Each student will:

a. Bow before they play and bow after their audition is complete.

b. perform one piece selected from the syllabus.

c. perform one piece contrasting in style and/or period (Baroque, Classical, Romantic or Contemporary). No arrangements or excerpts are permitted. All pieces must be original piano literature. Both selections must be of a comparable level.

Performance times are as follows:

Levels 1 & 2	8 minutes
Levels 3 & 4	10 minutes
Levels 5 & 6	11 minutes
Levels 7 & 8	14 minutes

Awards

All entrants will receive written comments on their performance to use with their teacher for further study. All participants will also receive a Certificate of Participation. Ribbons will be attached for *Outstanding*, *Excellent*, *Good* and *Fine Effort* Performances. If a student receives an *Outstanding* ranking, he or she will be eligible to participate in the Virtual Honors Recital.

Virtual Audition Instructions

We encourage students to video record on an acoustic instrument, if available, for the best possible sound (however, performances on digital pianos will be accepted as well). We suggest having a parent video record using a smartphone. The video must have audio, and the entire performer must be visible throughout. It must be clear that the student is playing by memory.

Two separate video links for the two pieces will be required. Bowing is required before and after the performance. Teachers or Parents can upload videos to YouTube and register, along with scans of the sheet music. Our website (www.pianoteachersforum.org) has many examples of Blue Ribbon intermediate and advanced students if you'd like to check them out!

Instructions for Uploading Video and Sheet Music: After your audition has been filmed, upload it as an "unlisted" YouTube video (see below).

Video Format: YouTube accepts any of the following video formats: .MO, .MPEG4, MP4, .AVI, .WMV, .MPEGPS, .FLV, 3GPP, and WebM.

Upload: Follow these directions to upload your completed video to an unlisted YouTube file. You can do this through the YouTube App or on a Computer.

1. Go to www.youtube.com and sign in. If you don't already have an account, create one. It can be easily linked to a gmail account.

2. Click the "UPLOAD" button at the top.

3. Either click on the "Select files to upload" box and select your video file from your device or drag/drop your video file into the box.

4. In the "Basic Info" screen, enter the appropriate title with the Student's Name in the box where the filename appears.

5. In the box below the title, enter the name of the piece being recorded.

6. Click the box that indicates the video is appropriate for children under 18.

7. Change the privacy setting from "Public" to "Unlisted."

8. Click "Done."

9. When the video is finished, copy the URL and paste it into your registration.

10. Attach images of student's music in PDF form in the same registration. It is acceptable to have markings.
